Weekend LeMons Race Team to Benefit Meals On Wheels

Fort Worth, TX: Meals On Wheels, Inc. of Tarrant County will benefit from this weekend's 24 Hours of LeMons race at Eagles Canyon Raceway in Decatur. Last Chance Racing, based out of Weatherford, will drive a 1993 Ford Probe displaying the number 12 in the race. Team captain Kevin Pinkston will use the race to raise funds for Meals On Wheels through per lap pledges and donations. The money raised will help provide hot, nutritious meals to homebound seniors of Tarrant County. "I chose Meals On Wheels as a way to give back to the community for the success I have experienced throughout my life" said Pinkston. "My great aunt Bernice helped raise me when I was a child, making helping the senior community seem even more appropriate."

The 24 Hours of LeMons (pronounced "lemons") race is an endurance-race series for cars that cost \$500 or less. The race is open to willing participants regardless of their racing experience. The vehicles race for 500 miles or until the vehicle falls apart, whichever comes first. This weekend's event, dubbed the North Dallas Hooptie 2010, begins at 10 a.m. on Saturday and 9:30 a.m. on Sunday. The cost is \$20 per day or \$30 for an all-access weekend pit pass.
